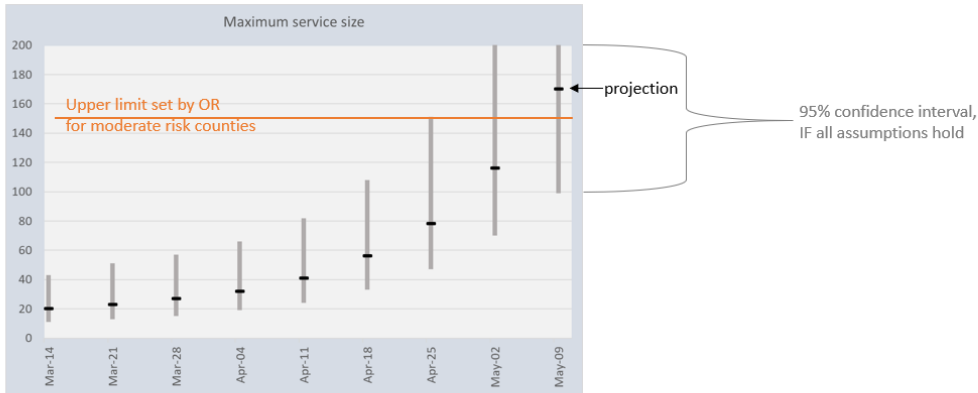

I'm at First Pres Portland, and this might interest you. We are considering reconvening in-person services in the near future. All along, we've had a single goal: when will it be safe? We decided that what that means is that the probability of having an infected person at a service is less than 1%, and I created a tool to calculate service size that would keep our risk to that level. I won't bother you with the details, but here's the product that our Session will be examining to help make the decisions of when and how much to reopen.



Black bars represent expected max limit, given some assumptions:

- infection levels in OR predicted by IHME model
- our area continues to exceed OR infection rates at the same level
- vaccinations continue at current levels
- our commitment to keeping the probability of an infection-free service above 99%

Gray bars represent the 95% confidence limits of that maximum service size

Despite the confidence interval, treat this as a very soft projection; there are a lot of assumptions folded in. Numbers farther in the future are less certain. We will redo these calculations by Easter and share results.
