Taborspace Mission Statement

The mission of the Taborspace Program is to create connected community, by providing a welcoming and nurturing gathering place, as a collaboration between the church and the neighborhood!

What is the congregation's or organization's vision for ministry:

We are a small aging congregation long established in our Mt. Tabor neighborhood, lovingly caring for our greater Portland, OR community. We have a mixture of traditional and non-traditional participants.

MTPC is a place for people to gather and worship and learn about God. We are open 7 days a week & God's work is being done even if things don't look "religious".

We recognize that built into the DNA and history of MTPC is a legacy of partnering and connection to the community around us.

The whole community participated in the building of our facility from the very beginning.

Our sanctuary is a place of music for young and old & open to quiet meditation and a place for new beginnings. We are regular participants in the *Portland Food Project*.

In 2008, we began a "Taborspace" (TS) ministry, opening our building to invite the neighborhood and community to share and partner with us. We strive to be a community space committed to a safe, healing, nurturing environment & to walk in the way of Jesus in service to others.

We continue to foster an environment of collaboration, partnering, shared ownership and teamwork, allocating space and multiple programs that benefit this community by providing healing, wellness, and peace.

This building hosts TS, a community coffee house, children's programs (including soccer practices on the lawn), divorce groups, AA meetings, counseling groups, and concerts.

How do you feel called to reach out to address the emerging needs of your community or constituency:

The growth of the Taborspace (TS) community ministry has been successful for more than ten years, & a major contributor to revenue generation— helping maintain our 35,000 sf & century+ old building.

MTPC/TS growth came to a halt with the onset of COVID-19 and resulting lockdown of 03/2020.

All MTPC/TS activities were closed, the congregation resorting to 'Zoom' to maintain online services and meetings. As it became apparent that the pandemic would continue — the manager and staff of TS were furloughed or let go.

In 12/2020, Pastor Carley Friesen, who had been instrumental with the vision of TS retired. MTPC remained committed to reopening TS as soon as public health and safety could be maintained, developing an ongoing contingency plan to support TS when public gathering would eventually resume.

TS's presence in the community was missed during the pandemic. TS is currently on track to again be a part of our community's outreach after a brief period of utilizing TS staff for short-term projects with assistance of the Paycheck Protection Program.

TS gradually began preparations in 05/2021 to reopen in 08/2021 with the help of three previous + three new TS staff. A new TS manager joined the team in 06/2022, bringing new ideas for building connections and relationships to the community around us. The Coffeehouse was reopened in 10/2022, a partnership with Favela Brazilian Cafe, bringing a new energy and excitement that is a catalyst for new ways to connect to the community.

How will this position help you to reach your vision and mission goals:

A new pastor will have the opportunity to continue to shape the vision while ministering to the needs of our aging congregation. One new challenge is to partner with the Taborspace manager and community to discern how a revitalized Taborspace might better address the needs of the community, including providing a safe environment for connection, healing, and dealing with the grief, pain and fear of a post-pandemic society.

We don't have the answers, but we believe that in listening and partnering with the community we can find the right questions to ask together in kindness, compassion and harmony that reflects the way of Jesus.

Provide a description of the characteristics needed by the person who is open to being called to this congregation and or organization:

We are looking for a friendly, outgoing, "people person" who relates well with others. The candidate needs to be able to coordinate and support the different groups within the building while being visible and connecting with individuals who enter the church. They need to be able to relate to cross generational community & membership and be able to connect & engage effectively with younger families & audiences. Their personality should demonstrate their openness, inclusiveness, energy, and their ability to communicate as a team member and leader.

This person has a warm, passionate, and hopeful energy about God's work, and blends their unique vision with others in serving the greater community. They should be fiscally wise, inspiring our Elders, Deacons and members, and challenge us with Biblically based sermons that encourage us to be light and love in the World. We are open to someone outside the norm, who can manage people with different backgrounds and beliefs. This person will be well versed in finding common ground, cultivating harmony and have the skills to manage conflict with compassion and kindness.

They should have some level of technology savvy regarding online outreach/zoom/social media & web.

What specific tasks, assignments, and program areas will this person have responsibility?

Lead Sunday Worship and Thursday Prayer Service

- Plan and lead hybrid worship service on site and Zoom at 10:00 am Sunday (Prior to COVID-19 there were 2 services a "Coffeehouse" interactive format service at 9:00 am and a more traditional format Sanctuary service at 11:00 am)
- Lead Thursday Prayer Service on Zoom Noon 12:30 pm

Provide Pastoral Leadership in Ministry (MTPC) and Outreach (TS)

- Model and advocate building bridges in relationships & networking outreach with the Good News.
- Speak and actively support diversity, inclusion and anti-racism in the way of Jesus.
- Write a weekly email newsletter to the congregation and Sunday bulletin.

Pastoral calling on sick, shut-ins and prospective members

- Collaboration with the Deacons in this ministry.
- Involvement with the church prayer chain.

Plan and moderate Session and Congregational meetings

Oversee preparation of the Annual Report

Work with committees to assist in carrying out their assigned tasks.

- Analyze staffing and committee structure of the church, recommend a model that best supports and integrates the mission and ministry of MTPC, TS, and Partners.
- Reorganize/revitalize committees aligned with the above proposed committee structure.
