

Adjunct Consultant, Pacific Northwest/Transition Services

DESCRIPTION

Transition Services is one of Partners' fastest growing programs. The Adjunct Consultant will work directly with the Director of Transition Services and other Partners' staff to coordinate workshops and consulting services to congregations, clergy, and judicatories with the goal of transitioning historic religious properties for community-serving purposes.

RESPONSIBILITIES

General

1. Report directly to the Director of Transition Services.
2. Serve as a point of contact for general inquiries on Transition Services in the Pacific Northwest.
3. Coordinate in-person workshops in the Pacific Northwest in consultation with the Director of Transition Services.
4. Serve as initial site visit liaison to potential consulting clients in the Pacific Northwest. In concert with the Director of Transition Services, support individual congregations and judicatories interested in or already involved in the process of transition.
5. Network with judicatories, congregations, clergy, and other non-profits interested in issues around transitions of sacred places.
6. Live in the Pacific Northwest and have the ability to travel regionally as needed.
7. This is a part-time, contract position.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Bachelor's Degree in architecture, historic preservation, religion, community development or humanities
- General familiarity with and comfort working in diverse faith traditions
- Willingness to learn more about congregational structures/challenges
- Flexibility to work independently, as well as collegially as a member of a team
- Proficiency with basic office technology
- Commitment to the mission and vision of Partners for Sacred Places

Other desirable qualities include:

- Clear and effective communication skills (public speaking, discussion facilitation)
