How would you describe the congregation's/organization's specific vision for ministry? How will this vision impact the community? Is the congregation part of a ministry vision or program?

First Presbyterian Church is a downtown church, founded 140 years ago during the formation of our town. It has served as a cornerstone within the community, providing opportunities for worship, fellowship, music, and service. Over the years, FPC members have actively taken part in local ministries sharing God's message of love through diverse acts of service.

Our on-going mission is to engage with our neighbors and respond to their needs. Guided by our mission statement, we strive to nurture individuals, addressing their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs with unconditional love, compassion, and humility.

Our Mission Committee works with local partners to secure volunteers, funding, and grants for food distribution to the low-income and homeless. We provide sack lunches and facilitate a food pantry. Additionally, FPC supports the Hawthorne Park project, hosts Narcotics Anonymous meetings, coordinates foot care with OSU nursing staff, and operates a respected childcare center.

Our congregation is known for its warmth and dedication to building meaningful connections within our group and the larger community. Oversight of progress towards our vision is managed by the Congregational Vitality Committee, which monitors activities and projects focused on enhancing the well-being of all current, visiting, and prospective members.

With new leadership, we hope to further expand these ministries and help our members deepen their spiritual connections and relationships with God.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

Nestled in the scenic Rogue Valley of Southern Oregon, Medford is a vibrant city celebrated for its beautiful landscapes, Mediterranean climate, rich outdoor recreation, cultural attractions, and excellent health care. It is a community that offers the best of both urban amenities and small-town charm. With 86,000 residents, Medford acts as the central hub for nearby towns and rural areas, bringing the total regional population to over 200,000.

Medford has an increasing number of retirees. Most FPC members are also retired. As we collected data for our 2025 mission study, we interviewed several local partners who named key challenges facing the community:

- Lack of affordable housing
- Limited job opportunities
- Shortage of mental health and substance abuse services
- Significant homeless population
- Hunger and food insecurity
- Insufficient support for children and families
- Gaps in services for seniors

Our ministries currently target hunger relief, health care support, and music and arts programs. Our initiatives boost community engagement and allow us to build meaningful partnerships. Looking ahead, we plan to connect with more diverse communities and families, partner with local schools, and develop programs tailored for older adults. We also plan to explore ways to use our facility's space in support of these new initiatives.

We seek a pastor who can help us cultivate creative outreach and build new partnerships to better serve Medford's community.

FPC is blessed with a core of faithful witnesses committed to sharing Christ's message within our church and the wider community. Key initiatives we have undertaken:

- Our missions committee and volunteers provide weekly meals and services to hundreds in need
- Our worship services benefit from a strong music program with a choir led by our new music director
- Deacons maintain regular contact with parish members and tend to their needs
- Building and ground staff ensure our facilities are well maintained and inviting
- The Congregational Vitality Committee continually works to strengthen our internal and organizational outreach
- Our recent mission study has identified existing strengths and posed opportunities for future growth

We are seeking a fellow traveler, spiritual leader, partner, and friend to help us in building on this momentum to advance our mission of "nurturing others in body, mind and soul for the glory of God". An ideal pastor will:

- Help bring people together in community and belonging
- Lend support to existing committees and programs

- Build partnerships within the community to address needs
- Extend outreach to children, families, and seniors
- Creatively embrace new opportunities for service

- A resilient and faithful shepherd who embraces the calling to serve as pastor with enthusiasm while showing personal autonomy

They should connect teachings to current issues, while keeping to our traditions of beauty and music in worship. They work closely with the music director and our worship committee in planning events.

Providing pastoral care is an essential responsibility. This involves building trusting relationships and giving spiritual and emotional support. The pastor's duties include mentoring, supporting individuals during hospital or home visits, offering crisis counseling, leading memorials and weddings, and working with the Deacons to meet the needs of the congregation.

FPC seeks a pastor who supports our mission, values ongoing projects, and brings fresh perspectives. We want a leader who advocates for Christ's work and builds partnerships in our community.

The pastor at FPC serves as head of staff, providing leadership to employees, church leaders, and volunteers in pursuit of our shared objectives. This position demands strong skills in organization, collaborative delegation, and effective supervision.

Foremost, FPC needs a pastor who will engage our church in adaptive change – guiding one of Christ's churches into the future world of service.
