Church Mission/Vision Statement

To be GATHERED by the Spirit as a community of faith, to GROW into the likeness of Christ, and to GLORIFY God every day in all we do. This is Oak Hills' purpose statement that guides all aspects of our ministry.

Grow: We believe that growing into the likeness of Christ involves studying God's Word and gathering together. We have also grown in number this year by welcoming the members of another congregation into our fold.

Glorify: Only when we surrender to the Spirit's work, allowing ourselves to be re-made in Christ's image, can we truly glorify God. We strive to glorify God through our local and global mission outreach. Some of our local outreaches include Backpack Buddies, WinterBlitz through the North Clackamas School District, and Love INC of Clackamas County. Globally, we support Lahash International and Wycliffe Bible Translators Kent and Kim Rasmussen.

Tasks, expectations, duties, supervision, assignments, and responsibilities for the position

1. Be head of staff, leading, directing, and supervising the pastoral program and staff.
2. Preach, lead in worship, administer the sacraments, and provide a teaching ministry, encouraging the spiritual growth of the membership and community.
3. Provide active leadership and encouragement to Session and the congregation in articulating vision and developing programs reflective of a Christ-centered community.
4. Oversee, encourage, and support the church committee ministries.
5. Provide leadership and resourcing in the area of organizational development and management of staff.
6. Moderate the Session. Through leadership and training, help the elders to become leaders in meeting Oak Hills' purpose and vision.
7. Strengthen and build member faithfulness and stewardship through teaching and discipleship.
8. Mentor others spiritually through small groups and Bible study.

9. Share in a ministry of compassion through hospital calling, crisis counselling, home visitation, and the performing of weddings and funerals.
10. Participate in the work and ministry of governing bodies beyond Session, as well as in ecumenical groups, global Christian movements, and local community life.
11. Plan for and participate in educational programs for personal and professional development in consultation with the Personnel Committee.
12. Model self-care and a family-first approach to ministry by taking rest and refreshment as needed and granted through benefits provided.

How would you describe the congregation's/organization's specific vision for ministry? How will this vision impact the community? Is the congregation part of a ministry vision or program?

Oak Hills' vision for ministry flows from our mission statement – to Gather, Grow, and Glorify (see above) – which we have been intentional in trying to understand and live out our various programs and ministries.

Our youth ministry's complementary vision captures the fundamental character of our church exceptionally well, from another angle: "To ensure all feel seen, valued, and cared for through the community and teachings of Christ." Those that attend our church feel the power of these words, often from their very first visit. Many of us were surprised to find a community that recognizes new faces, remembers names, and welcomes them into what feels like a family. We are a community that would be destined to be divided in any other context - young and old, Republican and Democrat, charismatic and liturgical, and everything in between. But as Paul entreats the church in Ephesus, we find ourselves united in Spirit, our similarities in Christ far outweighing our differences.

Though we have not yet partnered with any external vision or ministry programs, we believe as long as we do not lose sight of our Gospel-driven mission, the love, harmony, and peace that God has blessed us with will continue to be the source of the impact we see in our community.

As our church strives to more effectively gather, grow, and glorify, we greatly anticipate incorporating a new leader's vision and ideas with our own.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

The church is in an unincorporated suburban area south of Portland. The area immediately surrounding the church is a working, middle-class neighborhood.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

Like in much of the U.S., many of our neighbors lack connection and community. Due to its unincorporated nature, this area has traditionally been underserved in terms of community spaces and parks. While the county is now actively improving the local area with new facilities (including a new library, park, and community space), the church has traditionally filled this gap in a number of ways. We open our east field to walkers and dog owners, and many in the local community enjoy VBS, our annual easter egg hunts, and numerous youth outreaches. The church building also houses many community activities, and we are open to expanding this ministry.

The church has worked hard to expand its youth program and make the church accessible and welcoming for young families. Food insecurity, homelessness, and support for marginalized groups is always a local need. The church meets some of these needs, but there is always opportunity to partner with other churches and civic groups to do more.

How will this call help complement the responsibilities of other staff/volunteer positions, and the life of the congregation/organization, so that you may accomplish your short and long-term goals for ministry?

Oak Hills is seeking a pastor to join us in our current ministries and lead in new endeavors. Our ministry leaders, both part-time staff and volunteers, are effectively managing the church, and we desire to have a pastoral leader who will work alongside those leaders to oversee the church's vision and help them see how their individual ministries fit into the whole vision for Oak Hills. We seek a Christ-centered person who feels called to shepherd our flock, facilitate its spiritual growth, and help the congregation fulfill its God-given vision.

The ideal candidate should lead collegially among the church staff and volunteer leaders, recognizing the value and spiritual gifts of all. Our church staff positions include an associate pastor, a worship director, a choir director, an office administrator, a director of children's ministries, and a director of youth ministries. The candidate should be able to inspire and encourage church members to use their time, talents, and treasure in support of the goals of Oak Hills.

- Able to work in a team environment – doesn't try to do it all themselves

What areas of ministry do you expect the person called to be responsible for? Share specific tasks, assignments, and programs.

The Head of Staff for Oak Hills will serve in the following areas of ministry, each with unique responsibilities. We seek a Head of Staff who feels a conviction that shepherding is woven into everything they do.

Preach and teach - Proclaim God's Word, lead and plan worship, and nurture spiritual growth.

Administer sacraments - Celebrate Baptism and Communion.

Pastoral care - Provide counseling, comfort, and support in times of need or joy, including weddings and funerals. Coordinate with the care team for visiting home-bound and hospitalized congregants.

Session moderator - Prayerfully guide and encourage spiritual vision, discernment, and decisions.

Equip the Congregation - Encourage discipleship, train lay leaders, encourage volunteer growth, and foster mission.

Community and mission - Promote and participate in service, outreach, and witness in the wider community.

Connectional role - Represent Oak Hills at Presbytery and other ecumenical opportunities.

Administration - Oversee and work with Oak Hills' existing staff. Organize and moderate staff meetings. Contribute to the church's established communications plan.

Self-Care - The pastor will actively pursue their own spiritual growth.
